AN EVENTFUL SUMMER

Some of our most significant events took place during the past three months and gave further meaning to the Scottish Rite outreach:

June 12 – Three teachers from Alexandria, Arlington, and Fairfax County were honored as Teachers of the Year at our Temple. The open program, during dinner prior to our monthly meeting that night, included the presentation to each of a Certificate of Appreciation and a \$500 check. All three responded later with notes of appreciation for the Scottish Rite's interest in public education.

June 23 – Under the theme of "A Family Night Out" for our members, we sponsored a play at the Little Theatre of Alexandria which was attended by 198. We also provided bus transportation to the theatre and return to the Temple for those who wanted to avoid the parking difficulties in downtown Alexandria. All who attended were highly pleased with the event and the hilarious comedy "It Runs in the Family".

June 24 – A special 25th anniversary was observed at an afternoon reception and program at James Madison University. Ladies and brethren from Alexandria as well as from other Valleys were hosted and acclaimed by University officials for the Scottish Rite's summer clinic at JMU over the years.

August 22 – Representatives of 42 Blue Lodges and eight Masonic Districts gathered at the Scottish Rite Temple for a program dedicated to Blue Lodge Masonry. Mt. Carmel 133 of Warrenton was Host Lodge as one of its candidates became a Master Mason at the hands of a full cast of Scottish Rite brethren. Dinner was also provided to the nearly 200 in attendance.

Our overall membership status at this time is very good. The Spring Reunion added 30 to our rolls. There have also been a few reinstatements and affiliations; these, however, have been offset by a few demits and suspensions. As reported at the August meeting, there have been 36 deaths thus far compared to 39 a year ago. An even more encouraging happening is that in June of 2008 there were 113 members who owed two years dues; of these, 64 were suspended. In June of 2009, there were only 73 who were two years in arrears, and several of these brethren have since paid up.

Two things will help sustain this positive posture. First, an intensive effort by all is needed to increase the number of petitions for the Fall Reunion. Secondly, those now in arrears in dues need to “catch up” and become current to avoid suspension at the end of the year.

When the October 17 and 24 reunion takes place, I hope you will be proud of your role in getting some of those candidates in the Class.

COHEN TO REPRESENT THE SGIG IN ALEXANDRIA

In his letter of June 29, 2009, SGIG James D. Cole appointed Ill. Edmund Cohen to become his *Personal Representative* in the Valley of Alexandria effective on July 10. His letter, which was read in its entirety at the July 10 meeting, also explained the appointment of two Assistant Secretaries – Ill. David H. Smith, Sr. and David C. Brother Cohen, who is a Past Master of Henry Lodge No. 57, received his Scottish Rite degrees in the Spring Class of 1977. He was a long time participant and Degree Master of the 20th degree which is comprised solely of Henry Lodge members. In the mid-1990s, he assisted in the reunion Prompting function and eventually developed it into an effective Prompting Team.

He was a cast member of the 32nd degree when it was revised in the early 1990s, and performed that major part for many years. He is a member of Alexandria's 33rd degree team and performs a major part in that degree.

Most Worshipful Brother Cohen served as Grand Master of Masons in Virginia in 2008.

KCCH AND 33rd DEGREE HONORS

The Supreme Council will hold its Biennial Session for 2009 in Washington on October 5 and 6. All sessions, except the 33rd degree conferral, will be held at the Capital Hilton Hotel. The formal opening at 9 AM on the 5th will be open to all brethren and wives.

Among the Council's activities will be the election and announcement of brethren across the Southern Jurisdiction to be invested with the decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour or to be coroneted a Thirty-third Degree Inspector General Honorary. These honors will recognize the recipients' dedication to the Scottish Rite and their sustained contributions to its workings.

Alexandria will be granted a small number to become 33rd degree members and a larger number to become KCCHs. When their names are announced, we will want to congratulate each one on his highly regarded recognition. Their names will be published in the November-December Bulletin.

The 33^o will be conferred in Washington on October 6 under Supreme Council auspices, with the Alexandria Valley team conferring the degree. Alexandria will also perform the KCCH Investiture at the Richmond Scottish Rite Temple on October 31. Brethren, families, and friends are invited to this 2 o'clock program and tasty buffet that follows.

2010 DUES NOTICES

The Supreme Council will start mailing dues notices in September. If your 2009 dues were paid prior to July 12, 2009, you will receive your 2010 membership card in the same envelope as the dues statement. You should pay those dues as soon as possible; otherwise, later on you might think that since you have the 2010 card you must have paid the dues.

If you paid after July 12, or if you owed for 2008 and 2009, you will receive the notice only; your 2010 card will be sent to the Alexandria Secretary. When you make payment, the current year's card will be forwarded to you

The yearly dues, beginning with the 2010 year, are \$65. This change was initially described in the February-March Bulletin, proposed at the May 8 meeting, and enacted at the June 12 meeting. With this change, the fee for LIFE MEMBERSHIP will also be adjusted as described on page four.

The Feast of Tishri in Freemasonry derives from the Jewish Festival of Sukkoth which celebrates the harvest and commemorates the period after the exodus from Egypt during which the Jews wandered in the wilderness and lived in huts. Also called the Feast of Booths and Feast of Tabernacles, the biblical Festival of Sukkoth (also spelled Succoth) relates to the general celebration of Thanksgiving in America today and to Freemasonry, particularly the Scottish Rite's observance of the Feast of Tishri. Yet Freemasonry is an organization with no religious

agenda of its own, and this Masonic observance is done in such a manner as to be acceptable to men of all faiths.

This annual program will take place on Saturday, November 21. Those of you who are familiar with this special program know that it celebrates the dedication of King Solomon's Temple while also observing a Masonic Feast of Thanksgiving.
